PROJECT IMPACT

The strategic focus of S4RE in phase II is on deepening and widening of impact to achieve sustainability and scale. Building on the experiences and lessons-learnt from first phase, the project will seek to transfer the knowledge and experience of successful training and capacity-building models and solutions to the local partners so they can continue to provide services to youth and businesses, rather than providing essential skills and capacities itself as a project. The project aims to replicate or adapt in the other additional municipalities of the selected two regions successful models and solutions implemented in the four initial municipalities.

PROJECT AREAS AND ITS BENEFICIARIES

S4RE II continues to focus on the municipalities of the Sharr Mountains and the SouthEast of Kosovo, targeting four existing municipalities of Kamenice, Dragas, Strpce and Novobrdo and expanding its outreach to eight additional municipalities in these two regions.

The total beneficiaries are 6,000 unemployed youth, women and minorities, rural households as producers in supply chain or employees of local businesses, and training providers.

Young women and men age 15-35 (women target 50%), as well as ethnic minority groups (target 25%) who are amongst the most disadvantaged groups in these regions are the main target group for S4RE interventions, thus promoting gender and social inclusion.
